The main difference was in the number of songs sung by the all girls choir (men's choirs wouldn't form for several years). During this time an organist was desperately needed for Christmas Eve and Morning Masses. Edna Englert then only 15 years old was asked. She agreed even though she only knew how to play piano. Someone had to help her with the bellows. Edna was an active member of St. Wenceslaus up to the day Our Lord called her home after her 100th birthday!

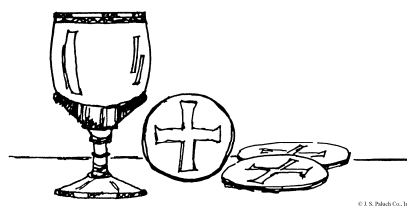

Tridentine Latin Mass

Beginning next Sunday, **August 3**, St. Wenceslaus will serve as a host parish for the Tridentine Latin Mass. This Mass will be celebrated at **1:30 PM** here at St. Wenceslaus with Father Phillips and Father Appel sharing the responsibilities of celebrant.

Requirements for the Celebration of Mass

The Mass according to the 1962 Missal has its own structure and logic. That Mass and the Mass according to the 1970 Missal are not to be combined in any way. At the same time, it is important to note that there is a distinction between the rubrics of the 1962 Missal (and the 1965 Rites listed below intended for use with the 1962 Missal) and liturgical laws that govern matters of external discipline. Many of the laws in this latter category that were in force in 1962 have since been abrogated. The faithful may choose to observe the former, more rigorous disciplines, but cannot be required to do so.

Specifically:

1. For celebrations taking place in the afternoon; the current discipline of fasting for one hour before communion (rather than the previous discipline of fasting for three hours) is to be observed.
2. Communion may be distributed in the hand and the faithful may receive Communion standing or a kneeler is to be provided.
3. The practice of women wearing a veil to symbolize their dignity and humility before God is optional for this Mass as well as it is for any other Mass.
4. With minimal adjustments, most sanctuaries can be made to accommodate to the rubrical needs of the extraordinary form.
